**THE NATIONAL TREASURY-BACKED FINANCING LOCALLY-LED
CLIMATE ACTION (FLLoCA) PROGRAM DISBURSES KSH 7.1 BILLION
TO BOOST CLIMATE RESILIENCE EFFORTS IN 45 COUNTIES**

The Financing Locally-Led Climate Action (FLLoCA) Program has disbursed KSh 7.1 billion to 43 county governments under the Third Cycle and final tranche of Phase I of the FLLoCA County Climate Resilience Investment (CCRI) Grants. The disbursement marks a significant milestone in Kenya's efforts to strengthen locally led climate action, enhance community resilience to climate change, and advance sustainable development through decentralized climate financing.

The Third Cycle disbursement adds on to KSh 4.6 billion that counties have contributed under County Contribution, which constitutes at least 1.5% of the county development budgets, as stipulated in the County Climate Acts. Together with KSh 1.2 billion funding from the German Government (KfW) to select counties, this brings the total CCRI 3 funding for the year 2025/2026 to KSh 11.7 billion.

Through this latest tranche of funding, the 45 participating counties will implement community-driven climate resilience projects tailored to address their unique vulnerabilities and development needs. The investments are expected to strengthen livelihoods, protect critical ecosystems and infrastructure, enhance food and water security, and build long-term resilience to climate-related shocks while advancing sustainable local development.

The CCRI Grants disbursed demonstrates the growing maturity of Kenya's locally led climate finance model: counties are mobilizing their own resources, qualifying through performance assessments, and translating County Climate Change Action Plans into practical investments identified with communities.

"This disbursement represents more than a financial transfer; it is an investment in the resilience, prosperity, and future of our communities. Through the FLLoCA Program, we are demonstrating that climate finance can be delivered effectively to the local level, where climate impacts are most deeply felt and where solutions can have the greatest impact. By empowering County Governments and communities to lead climate resilience investments, we are accelerating adaptation, strengthening local institutions, protecting livelihoods, and advancing sustainable development across the country. This is climate action in practice—locally led, community-driven, and focused on delivering lasting results for the people of Kenya," said **Hon. 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The County Climate Resilience Investment (CCRI) Grants are supported by the Government of Kenya in partnership with the World Bank and the Governments of Germany, Sweden, Denmark, and the Netherlands.

Unlike conventional financing mechanisms, the County Climate Resilience Investment (CCRI) Grants are performance-based, rewarding counties that demonstrate strong institutional capacity, sound climate governance, and commitment to locally led climate action. The current disbursement follows the successful completion of the Third Annual Performance Assessment (APA), which evaluated counties against a set of Minimum Performance Conditions designed to ensure accountability, transparency, and readiness to manage climate investments effectively.

"The strength of the FLLoCA Program lies in its ability to place communities at the centre of climate action. Through the Annual Performance Assessment framework, we are ensuring that climate finance reaches counties that have demonstrated the institutional capacity, governance systems, and commitment required to deliver meaningful results. By linking funding to performance and locally identified priorities, we are strengthening accountability, deepening community participation, and enabling counties to implement climate resilience investments that respond directly to the realities faced by their people," said **Dr. Chris Kiptoo, CBS, Principal Secretary, The National Treasury.**

The funding will enable qualifying counties to accelerate the implementation of their County Climate Change Action Plans (CCCAPs), translating climate priorities into tangible investments that address local vulnerabilities and strengthen community resilience. Across the country, the program has so far supported more than 2,200 locally identified resilience projects spanning water access, climate-smart agriculture, landscape restoration, renewable energy, and livelihood diversification. The investments, currently being implemented in 1,238 wards, are projected to provide over one million Kenyans with improved access to water for drinking and agriculture, while also supporting sustainable land management, landscape restoration, and climate-resilient livelihoods for rural communities.
