"'e Government has reeased Sh. 396.16 million to beneficiaries registered under the Inua Jamii Cash Transfer Programme in Murang'a County.

The County Director of Social Services, Ms Esther Maina noted that those gistered in the programme started receiving their stipend for four months from May 5 this year.

Each of the beneficiaries, she added, will receive a total of Sh 8,000 covering November, December, January and February.

"We expect all the beneficiaries to get their money within a short period of time so as to cushion them from financial challenges," Maina told KNA in her office.

From the amount, Sh. 338.06 million is supposed to go to older persons. Murang'a has 42,258 registered aged people registered in the programme

"Another Sh. 6.9 million will be paid to 863 persons living with severe disabilities and Sh. 51.2 million will go to orphans ra1 : children," she

Ms Maina further said currently, the payment is easy because all the beneficiaries have opened bank accounts.

"We concluded opening bank accounts for all beneficiaries. The beneficiaries were given a chance to choose banks

Persons living with severe dis-abilities who will receive grants

which will ensure they will easily access their funds. Five commercial banks are contracted by the ministry to do the payments.

"With bank accounts, the beneficiaries, especially the aged, can access their money at bank agents in rural areas instead of traveling to major towns." Maina further explained

The Director further noted that they have also changed caregivers of some of the beneficiaries who requested for the

"Some aged people complained of mischief from their caregivers and requested for change and we concluded the process with assistance from chiefs," st.e added.

She warned the caregivers to ensure the beneficiaries get all their money and use it prudently

"We have also been counseling and training the beneficiaries on how to prudently spend the stipend. The money is supposed to help them get food and medication among other expenses," Maina added.

Meanwhile Maina said they have cleaned the register to remove beneficiaries who passed on saying previously, relatives and caregivers failed to report the demise of a benericiary.

"With a bank account, it is now easy to note when a beneficiary passes on. Before then, it was hard as relatives failed to report to us when one died. The government is also in process of recruiting new beneficiaries which I assume will be in the next financial year," she remarked.

Kenya's inaugural **Drone Expo set for** take off next month

ver 100 certified drone technology experts and enthusiasts are expected to take part in Kenya's first ever Drone Tech and Data Expo which is scheduled to run from 29th May to 4th June 2022.

The event, which is the first of its kind in Kenya, has been organized by Drone Space Kenva, in conjunction with the Kenya Civil Aviation Authority (KCAA) and Konza Technopolis Development Authority (KoTDA).

ICT Cabinet Secretary Joe Mucheru is among the keynote speakers at the conference of the Expo themed 'The Role of Drones and Data in Spurring Economic Growth in Kenya and the 4th Industrial Revolution in Africa.

The Expo will kick off with a two-day conference that will take place at Nairobi's Kenvatta International Convention Centre (KICC) on 30th & 31st May

Speaking in a Nairobi hotel during the Kenya Drone Week, Media breakfast kick off, ICT, Innovation and Youth Affairs Principal Secretary Jerome Ochieng' said having seen the potential that technology has in solving day-to-day problems, Kenya will not be left behind and his ministry is keen to deploy technologies for the benefit of all Kenyans.
